Market updates

Yangshan port phase 2 to open by the end of the year and add 2.5m TEU capacity!

The second phase of China's Yangshan deepwater port is expected to begin operations at the end of this year. The new terminal development is being built to ease congestion at the Shanghai port. The new cargo complex, located adjacent to phase 1, will have a quay length of 1,400 meters and cover an area measuring around 700,000 square meters when completed. Its four berths will add an extra 2.5 million TEU in container handling capacity. Since starting operations at the end of 2005 through to the end of August 2006, Yangshan has handled 1.84 million

TEU, with an average of 7,588 TEU passing through the terminal each day. Once phase 2 begins operation, the port of Yangshan will boast a total quay length of 3,000 meters, 9 deep-water berths and 34 quay cranes.

Presently, the traffic of Northern and Central Europe, South America and the east coast of North America is handled through the new Yangshan port. Schenker operates a 12,000 square meters CFS warehouse in the Lingang Logistics Zone, close to the port.
