The Art Cars collection has been traveling on Beijing's roads with Schenker *fairs*

Since 1975, outstanding artists from all over the world have been designing the BMW automobiles of their era. The Art Cars reflect the developments in art history with regard to fine art, design and technology and are displayed worldwide in major museums such as the Paris Louvre, the Royal Academy in London, the New York Whitney Museum of Modern Art and many others.

On September 14, 2006, the unique BMW Art Car Collection started its world tour through international museums worldwide. BMW cars designed by artists like Frank Stella (1976), Roy Lichtenstein (1977), Andy Warhol (1979), and Ken Done (1989) have been presented in the Gallery Petronas in Kuala Lumpur / Malaysia from September 14 until October 22, 2006. In a parallel tour the BMW Art Cars of Alexander Calder (1975), Matazo Kayama (1990), David Hockney (1995), and Jenny Holzer (1999) will be exhibited throughout Mainland China & Taiwan, Russia and Africa. From January 7-22, the art cars could be seen as part of

the “Art in Motion” exhibition in the Long March Space in Beijing. When entrusted with the transport of such sensitive and valuable freight, professional and specialized handling becomes mandatory. Market updates

Dalian port handled 24m tons of cargo in 2006

The mainland port of Dalian recorded a 20.1 per cent increase in cargo throughput last year to 145.2 million tons, a rise of 24.2 million tons over 2005, the Dalian Port Group announced. Meanwhile, Logistics Week reported that the port's container throughput shot up by 21.2 per cent to 3.2 million TEU, 680,900 TEU more than in 2005.

The publication also said four new container berths in the second phase of Dayaowan started operations last year, boosting Dalian capacity from 2.5 million TEU to 3.9 million TEU.

In 2006, Dalian Port introduced 17 shipping new services, comprising three long ocean services and 14 short ones.
