## Schenker nominated contractor for the 2008 Olympic Equestrian Games

Schenker Hong Kong was nominated as venue logistics provider of the 2008 Beijing Olympic and Paralympic Games – Hong Kong Equestrian Events by the Hong Kong Jockey Club. Schenker's contract covers the complete venue logistics planning as well as movements inside the two competition venues – the Hong Kong Sports Institute (HKSI) in Shatin and Beas River venue.

The Equestrian Games will take place from 9-19 August 2008, followed by the Paralympic Equestrians from

6-17 September. However, the planning phase at Schenker began right after our appointment in October 2007. "Over 30 people have been chosen for the planning, executing, and running of the event. Fairs & Exhibitions contribute around 80% of those resources, while 20% come from other departments, such as Airfreight and Customer Service. James Longcroft, Ricky Yan and I are leading the operation. Labour-wise we have filed a pool of over 300 headcounts ready to go", says Clement Law, General

Manager Fairs, Events & Relocations of Schenker Hong Kong.

The first Schenker crew members are expected to be placed on site in HKSI from 26 May lasting until end of September 2008. Schenker will be responsible to move cargos such as the overlay of the venue, ice, beddings, horse jumps, equipment, feed, etc. Equipment will include trucks, transit trucks, vans, forklifts, a crane, a boom lift, and a cherry picker.
